



RESULTS FROM GENFORWARD -- A NATIONALLY REPRESENTATIVE SURVEY OF YOUNG PEOPLE AGE 18-30 TAKEN FEB. 16 - MARCH 6 BY THE BLACK YOUTH PROJECT WITH THE AP-NORC CENTER


✓ About 2 in 3 young adults in each racial and ethnic group believe the country is off on the wrong track

- Sixty-eight percent of African Americans, 68 percent of Asian Americans, 64 percent of Latino/as, and 61 percent of whites say the country is off on the wrong track
- The percent of young adults who say the country is off on the wrong track rose from 52 percent in December to 63 percent in February

✓ A majority of young adults of each racial and ethnic group report participating in politics since the election

✓ Young adults' beliefs about the three most important problems facing the country vary by race and ethnicity, but education is a key problem for all groups


- African Americans are most likely to say the key problems are racism (43 percent), health care (25 percent), and education (22 percent)
- Asian Americans are most likely to say the key problems are health care (30 percent), immigration (30 percent), racism (26 percent), and education (26 percent)
- Latino/as are most likely to say immigration (46 percent), racism (34 percent), and education (25 percent) are key problems
- Whites are most likely to say the key problems are health care (29 percent), environment and climate change (26 percent), and education (25 percent)

✓ Health care and immigration, two priorities for the Trump administration, are key issues for many Millennials

- There is growing concern among young adults about immigration as those who identify it as one of the most important problems has risen from 14 percent in October to 27 percent in February
