






## RESULTS FROM GENFORWARD -- A NATIONALLY REPRESENTATIVE SURVEY OF YOUNG PEOPLE AGE 18-30 TAKEN FEB. 16 - MARCH 6 BY THE BLACK YOUTH PROJECT WITH THE AP-NORC CENTER

- Across all racial and ethnic groups, majorities disapprove of Donald Trump's performance as president
- About 7 in 10 African Americans (71 percent), Asian Americans (69 percent), and Latino/as (72 percent) disapprove of Trump's performance compared with 55 percent of whites
- Majorities of young adults of all races and ethnicities have negative views of Trump's policies and his demeanor

## Many young adults question Trump's polices and demeanor % who say been somewhat or very bad ...




Questions: How do you think President Trump is doing in terms of the policies that he has put forth so far? How do you think President Trump is doing in terms of his demeanor (i.e., is he acting "presidential"?)

- Few young adults of any race or ethnicity have a favorable opinion of Vice President Mike Pence
- About 1 in 4 whites (28 percent) and Asian Americans (25 percent) have a favorable opinion of Pence compared with 11 percent of African Americans and 13 percent of Latino/as
- Few young adults in each racial and ethnic group know much about Stephen Bannon or Kellyanne Conway
  - Majorities of African Americans and Latino/as do not know enough about either Bannon or Conway to have an opinion about each of them, while about 4 in 10 Asian Americans and whites say the same

- Majorities of young adults of all races and ethnicities disapprove of how Trump has dealt with Russia
- Sixty-two percent of African Americans, 61 percent of Asian Americans, 55 percent of Latino/as, and 51 percent of whites disapprove of how Trump is dealing with Russia
- About 6 in 10 African Americans (58 percent), Asian Americans (63 percent), Latino/as (56 percent), and whites (54 percent) report the U.S. should not work more closely with Russia
- Young adults of color are more likely than whites to say Russian interference hampered the 2016 election outcome
  - Majorities of all races and ethnicities believe Russia intervened in the 2016 election
- Young whites are less likely than young adults of color to say Russian interference hampered the 2016 election outcome
