### Methodology

The GenForward October 2025 survey is a project of Professor Cathy J. Cohen at the University of Chicago. Interviews were conducted with a representative sample from GenForward<sup>SM</sup>, a nationally representative survey panel of adults recruited and administered by NORC at the University of Chicago.

A total of 802 interviews were conducted during October 24 to November 10, 2025 with adults ages 18+ representing the 50 states and the District of Columbia, including completed interviews with 179 African American adults, 44 Asian American/Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander adults, 53 Latinx adults, 516 white adults, and 10 adults with other racial and ethnic backgrounds. The survey was offered in English and Spanish and via telephone and web modes.

The GenForward survey was built from two sample sources:

- 52.4 percent of the completed interviews are sourced from NORC's AmeriSpeak® Panel and from the Black Youth Project (BYP) panel of young adults recruited by NORC. Funded and operated by NORC at the University of Chicago, AmeriSpeak® is a probability-based panel designed to be representative of the US household population. Randomly selected US households are sampled with a known, non-zero probability of selection from the NORC National Frame and address-based sample, and then contacted by US mail, telephone interviewers, overnight express mailers, and field interviewers (face to face). The BYP sample is from a probability-based household panel that uses an address-based sample from a registered voter database of the entire US. Households were selected using stratified random sampling to support over-sampling of households with African American, Latinx American, and Asian American/Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander young adults. NORC contacted sampled households by U.S. mail and by telephone, inviting them to register and participate in public opinion surveys twice a month.
- The AmeriSpeak® panel sample was supplemented with respondents from the Dynata and Prodege nonprobability online opt-in panel(s). 47.6 percent of the completed interviews are sourced from the Dynata and Prodege panel(s). To help to reduce potential bias in the nonprobability sample, Dynata and Prodege attempted to balance the nonprobability respondent sample by age, race and ethnicity, gender, and partisanship. In order to incorporate the nonprobability sample, NORC used TrueNorth calibration services, an innovative hybrid calibration approach developed at NORC based on small area estimation methods in order to explicitly account for potential bias associated with the nonprobability sample. The purpose of TrueNorth calibration is to adjust the weights for the nonprobability sample so as to bring weighted distributions of the nonprobability sample in line with the population distribution for characteristics correlated with the survey variables. Such calibration adjustments help to reduce potential bias, yielding more accurate population estimates.

Of the 802 total interviews in the GenForward October 2025 survey, 98.8 percent were completed by web and 1.2 percent by telephone. The survey completion rate is 22.3 percent. The weighted AAPOR RR3 panel recruitment rate is 26.2 percent and the weighted household panel retention rate is 78.4 percent, for a weighted AAPOR RR3 cumulative response rate of 4.6 percent. The overall margin of error is ±3.09 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level, including the design effect. Among subgroups, the margin of error at the 95 percent confidence level is ±7.22 percentage points for African Americans, ±8.37 percentage points for Asian Americans/Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders, ±6.86 percentage points for Latinx Americans, and ±4.33 percentage points for white Americans.

To encourage cooperation, respondents were offered incentives for completing the survey that ranged from the cash-equivalent of \$5 to \$10.

The interviews from the two probability-based sample sources were combined for statistical weighting and analysis. The combined panel samples provide sample coverage of approximately 97 percent of the U.S. household population. The statistical weights incorporate the appropriate probability of selection for the BYP and AmeriSpeak samples, nonresponse adjustments, and also, raking ratio adjustments to population benchmarks. In addition, raking by Midwest vs. non-Midwest and Metro vs. non-Metro was incorporated. The Midwest was defined as six states—OH, IL, IN, MI, MN, and WI—with all other states classified as non-Midwest. Within each of these geographic categories, raking was applied to the same socio-demographic variables: age, gender, and education.

A poststratification process is used to adjust for any survey nonresponse as well as any non-coverage or under- and over-sampling resulting from the study-specific sample design. The poststratification process was done separately for each racial/ethnic group and involved the following variables: age, gender, education, Census Region, and partisanship. The weighted data were used for all analyses unless otherwise noted.
